Chinese Basic - Undergraduate

1. Course Description

This is the basic course designed for students who have no previous knowledge of the language. While the linguistic aspects of the language will be the primary focus, introduction to the cultural background of the language will be integrated throughout the course. Students will learn basic vocabulary, sentence structures, and simple grammar.

2. Course Objectives and Requirements

1. **Course Objectives**: The primary goals of the course are 1) to develop basic communication skills of Mandarin Chinese in all components (speaking, listening, writing, and grammar) with focus on pronunciation and tones, 2) to learn the cultural background of Chinese idiographic characters and idioms, and 3) to understand the appropriate behavior and rules of etiquette in Chinese speaking environments.

2. **Requirements**: Students are expected to get prepared for presentations, finish and submit in-class and after-class assignments as required.
