One last thing I'd appreciate in this experience is the memorable time I spent with those lovely guys from different countries of the world. We cooked, we partied, we laughed and the one year abroad accelerates our growth.

To summarize, the experience of studying in ESCP-Europe provides me lots of precious memories. Thanks to this chance, endeavored by many teachers in SEM, Tongji University, we are favored with both knowledge and skills which, we believe, will benefit us in the rest of our lives.
